What is Violence Interruption?

Violence interruption involves working with people at risk of committing or being the target of violence to prevent violence. It is an urgent response to violence. Violence interrupters from the community work in the community to find alternatives to looming violent situations.

background

In the summer of 2022, through a partnership between the Department of Health's Gun Violence Intervention Team and the Annapolis Mayor's Office, Cure Violence Global came to Annapolis for a week-long assessment to address and decrease gun violence through violence interruption.

Members of the Cure Violence team met with a wide range of stakeholders, including the city and county leaders, agencies, community organizations, some of whom are in the streets working with at-risk individuals, others of whom provide a range of preventive and social services. They met with the Annapolis Police who are on board and know that any violence interruption program would run in parallel with their work. They also met with city agencies like the Housing Authority.

Why Eastport?

In 2023, the Anne Arundel County Department of Health held listening sessions in Annapolis communities identified through the Cure Violence Global assessment as locations where a violence interruption program could be implemented.

The purpose of these listening sessions were to identify which area would be the best fit for a Violence Interruption Program.

Through these listening sessions, Eastport residents expressed interest in having a violence interruption program in their community.



From 2018 through August 2023 There were 74 homicides or gun injuries (excluding suicides) within a 1 mile radius of Eastport Terrace.

There were 141 homicides or gun injuries (excluding suicides). From January - August 2023 there were 5 homicides and 5 contact shootings within a mile radius of Eastport Terrace

What is Violence Interruption?

Violence interruption involves working with people at risk of committing or being the target of violence to prevent violence. The work is done by trained violence interrupters, who work in the streets and are from the communities they are working in. They have to have credibility in those communities.

What's the difference between violence interruption and violence prevention?

Violence prevention is a broader strategy that works with communities to decrease the overall level of violence. While these approaches go hand in hand, violence interruption is an intense and specialized set of work.

How it works

Violence Interruption hires members of the community who have had similar life experiences to those at highest risk of committing acts of violence.

Staff are trained and receive extensive education and coaching in evidence-based methods of mediation, persuasion, behavior change, and norm change — all of which are essential for limiting the spread of outbreaks of violence.

The work includes:

- Detecting and interrupting potentially violent situations
- Identifying and changing the thinking and behavior of the highest risk transmitters (those most likely to engage in violence)
- Changing group norms that support and perpetuate the use of violence.

The work violence interrupters do takes a public health approach that recognizes that violence spreads much like infectious diseases do.

<u>Cure Violence</u> is a national organization that has been working for more than two decades to interrupt cycles of violence in communities. They explicitly take a public health approach, one that recognizes that violence spreads much like infectious diseases do.
